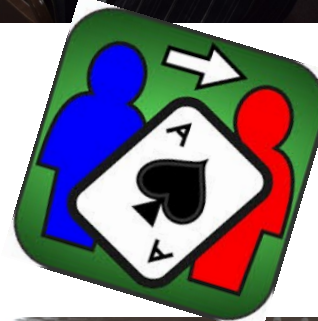

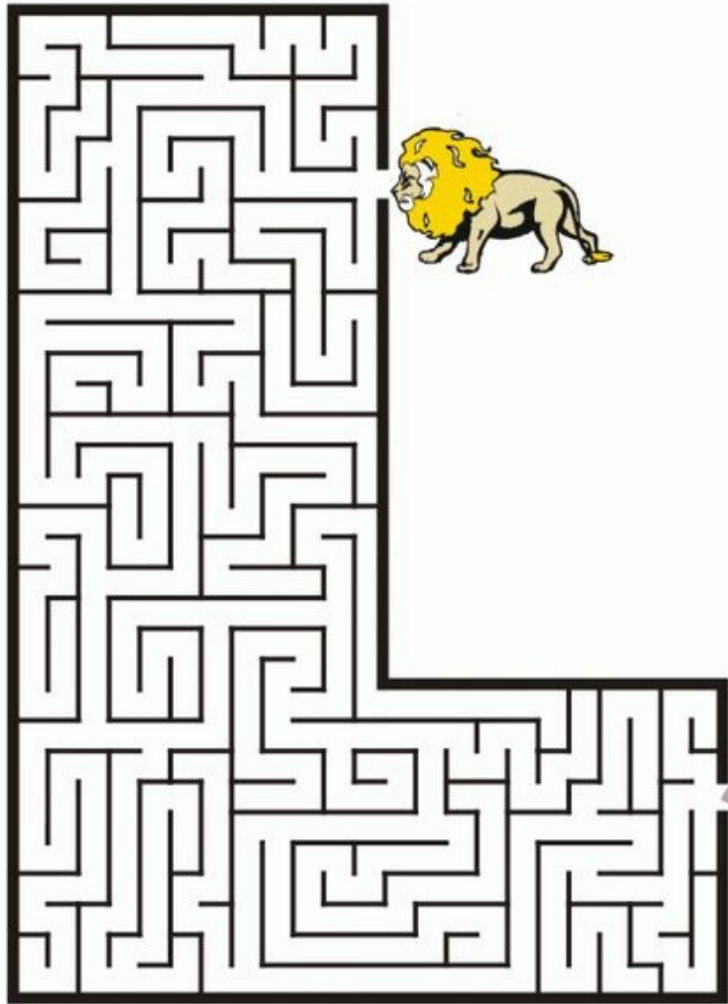

Club purchased groceries for a needy family

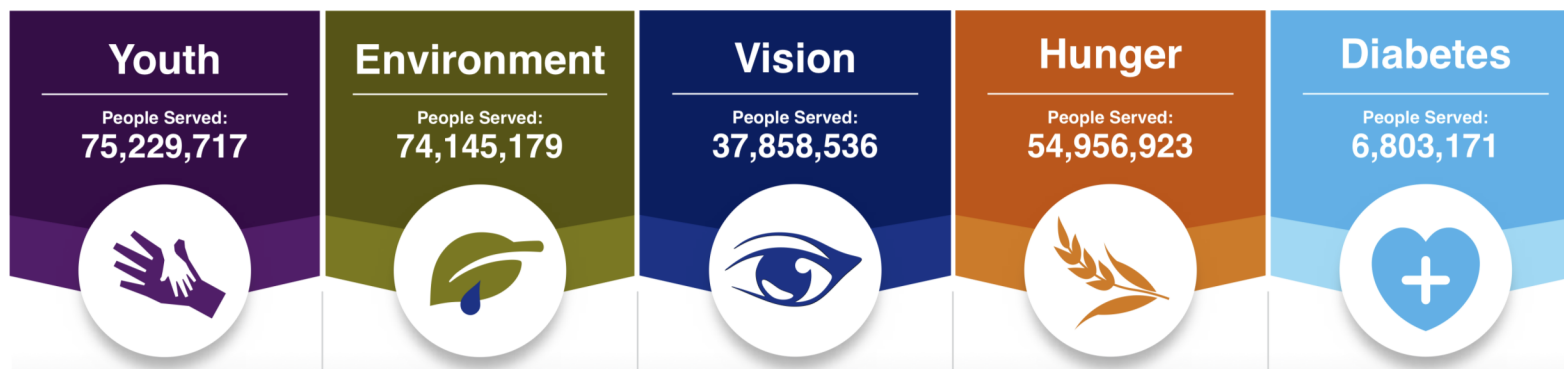
